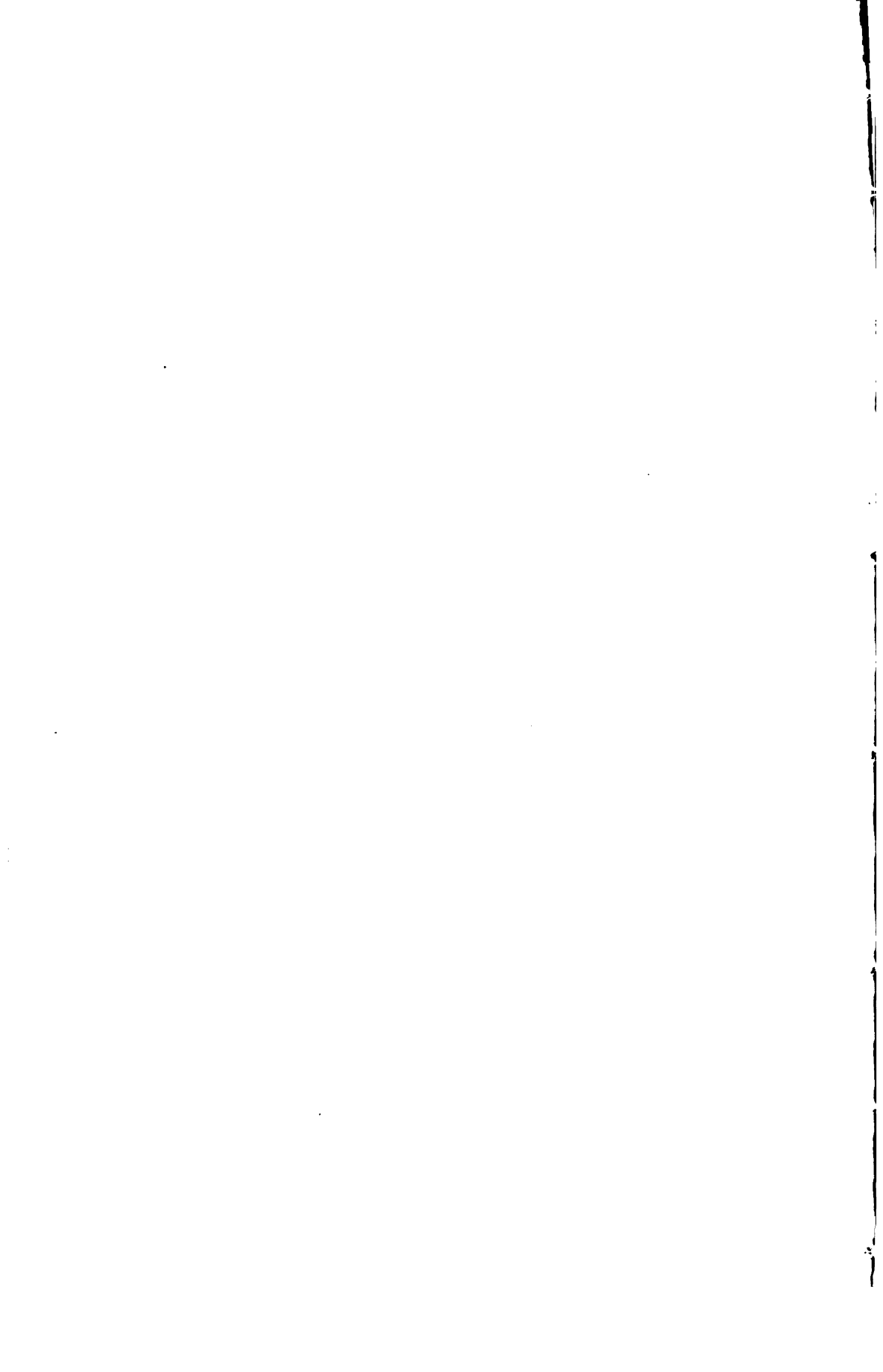


Arnold Birckmann and his heirs. Cologne, 1562—1592.

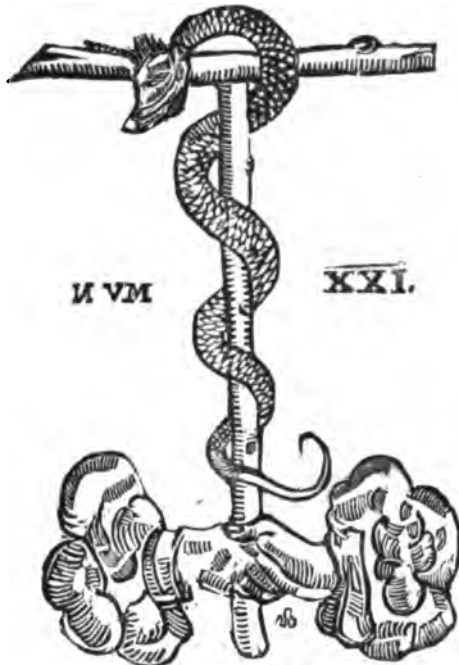
